General footnotes

Retirement in 2010 of Administrator Karen Matze drove salaries/wages higher than usual due to retirement payouts. Also, the newly hired administrator overlapped her departure by one week to facilitate seamless turnover so in essence the Village had two administrators on payroll for that week. All funds bearing their respective percentage of these costs were overbudget for 2010. It was an unanticipated event.

FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES (FTE)

Use FTE numbers where FTE stands for full-time employees or full-time equivalency. FTE can be computed by using total hours worked/2080 hours for a fiscal year. Estimate to the nearest tenth. If an employee works part time for more than one industry then determine FTE based on estimate of hours worked per industry.

Example: An employee worked 35% of their time on electric jobs, 30% on water jobs, 20% on sewer jobs and 15% on municipal nonutility jobs. The FTE by industry would be .4 for electric, .3 for water and .2 for sewer.

Acct 920 - The former administrator, Karen Matze, retired in 2010. The new administrator overlapped his employment with hers by one week to facilitate a smooth changeover. This created a portion of the spike in the account. The bulk of the increase was caused by Karen's vacation and sick time payout of which a portion is charged to the water utility for the oversight of water utility issues performed by the administrator.

Acct 903 - Two new computers were purchased for the clerks involved in doing the utility billing, payroll processing, and accounts payable processing. The water utility bore it's portion of this necessary purchase. In addition to the need for faster processing due to the upgrade of the utility billing/cash receipting software, one of the other computer's hard drive crashed.

Acct 902 - The Accounting Clerk position which handles the utility billing/accounting functions was created and hired the last quarter of 2009. For 2010 there is a full year's worth of wages and benefits charged to the water utility (it's portion only). That is why the increase in this account.

Acct 650 - In 2009, the water tower was cleaned. No maintenance was scheduled during 2010.

Acct 631 - Well #4 usage dropped to normal levels since the rehab of wells #2 and #3 were completed in 2009. Well #4 requires much more chemical treatment than wells #2 or #3. The chemical expense for 2010 is more representative of a normal year's expense than 2009 was.

Acct 625 - 2009 included rehab expenses for wells #2 and #3. No rehabbing was done in 2010.

Acct 605 - 2009 included rehab expenses for wells #2 and #3. No rehabbing was done in 2010.
